This year's itinerary highlights the southern part of our county and includes: Headquarters Farm in Delaware Twp.; the Prallsville Mill in Stockton; Oak Summit School, Old Stone Church and Cemetery in Kingwood, Holcombe Jimison Farmstead in West Amwell; the Black River and Western Railroad in Ringoes and the Marshall House in Lambertville. The event is scheduled to end at 2 p.m. with participants meeting in Lambertville.

Treasure Hunterdon will also feature door prizes and a raffle for a \$250 gift certificate for the Hunterdon Land Trust Farmers' Market.

Tickets cost \$30 per adult, and \$15 for children 16 (free for children 4 and under), with all proceeds benefiting the Land Trust's efforts to safeguard the rural character and special places of Hunterdon County.
