

TOUR DETAILS

We start out by visiting an eighteenth century restored barn on Wertsville Road. This barn has great openness and attention to detail with lots of original art throughout. The beam structure is amazing and the owner has carefully kept its unique character in full view.

On the same property is a second building designed by an architect as his own home. The building was designed in the Bauhaus style with walnut floors and lots of wood throughout.

From there we go to a Victorian home on North Hill Rd. The house has high ceilings, elaborate moldings and the most amazing heirloom furniture. The property has great views and even an indoor pool.

Next we go to Lindbergh Rd. where a circa 1780 house has been restored. With all the charm of a period residence, this amazing home has a western touch here and there. Before you leave you get to feed carrots to the horses.

Finally we go across the township to Boss Rd where a mid-century home is finished in a "shabby chic" country style. The house has been warmly decorated for the holidays.

We end our tour at the Municipal Building, where you may drive yourself around the corner to the historic Harvest Moon Inn. Here, the Historical Society will provide cookies and cider. Stronger libations are available for purchase.
