Walking or driving tours of Flemington's Historic Churches

The Hunterdon County Historical Society and the Calvary Episcopal Church are partnering to offer walking or driving tours of four of Flemington's historic churches on Sunday, **October 28, 2018 from 1:00-3:30 pm.**

The tours begin with ticket sales and tours of the Historical Society's 1845 Doric House at 1:00 p.m. at 114 Main Street in Flemington. Church tours may be walked, (1.3 miles) or driven in any order after getting a tickets-- but tours end at the Cavalry Episcopal Church with refreshments. The \$5.00 ticket sale price per person will be donated to a local food pantry.

Church historians will be on-hand at each of the four churches: Calvary Episcopal, Flemington United Methodist, Flemington Baptist and the Flemington Presbyterian and will share the fascinating history of these houses of worship. A history- rich tour booklet with the ticket sale describes the history and architecture of these beautiful buildings. Also included will be a self-guided walking tour brochure describing other buildings along the way.
